

#### **COURSE UPDATE**

#### Hi All,

We have now reached the month of September, and we are still watering greens!! This is certainly the best, and driest summer I can remember for a while, usually by this time we have worn away the rubber on the squeegees trying to shift water from greens and are having to tip-toe around the course for fear of getting stuck. One of our older members commented to me the other day that the course is so much tidier with the rough all being cut at the same height. I agreed but had to remind him of the 3 or 4 wet summers we have endured lately, which have meant cutting these areas was at times not possible, for fear of getting stuck in the mud!!!

In an effort to alleviate some of the wetter parts of the course, I am delighted to say that the proposed drainage programme went ahead as planned and was finished on schedule. I would like to thank everyone who played during this time for their patience and cooperation when we had to shorten one or both of the holes to allow the contractor to carry out the work safely. I am sure this will make a big difference to this area during wetter periods, and thus further improve our course.

While we are on the subject, I would like to pay homage to our current committee of management who have seen fit to release funds not only for this drainage programme, but also for a general budget increase which has allowed us to buy extra fertiliser and chemicals initially, which can only help with the general aesthetics of the course. (Next year we are getting a new automated irrigation system at a cost of £300,000 - cant wait!!!)

Hate to mention this, but over the next few weeks we will be starting to do Autumn renovations to tees greens and fairways. We will be aerating the greens on the week commencing 20th September and the contractor who has just completed the drainage, is coming back in to aerate the fairways, the first week in October. Again obviously there will be some disruption to play with both these tasks, but we will keep it to a minimum and ask for your cooperation again.

Finally congratulations to my mate Craig Macnicol on winning the club championship for the 78th time.lol

### **RULES REFRESHER**

#### My ball hit a marker on the green and went in the hole - What do I do?

It is not a penalty. In fact, in this situation, the ball is holed.

There is an exception to Rule 11.1b that says when a ball in motion hits a ball marker on the putting green, the stroke counts and the ball must be played as it lies. In this case, it's in the hole so write the score down and move on.



Of course before the stroke, a player whose ball marker might help or interfere with play can move it out of the way if it is their own, using Rule 15.3c, or, if the marker belongs to another player, require that player to move it.
