This booklet contains information on the Office Bearers, committee of management, arrangements for booking a tee time, rules governing all competitions, fixtures for the season and current subscription rates.

BOOKING A TEE TIME

Unless other specific arrangements are in place, play on the course is controlled by the online timesheet which can normally be accessed via the club website, by telephone to the pro.shop or by attending in person at the pro. shop. The sheet is set up so that times can be booked seven days in advance. This applies both to bounce games and competitions. All players must sign in at the pro. shop before playing on any day and in any competition.

GENERAL NOTES

- 1. The First Tee is closed to gentlemen on Tuesdays from 11.30am 12.30pm and from 3.30pm 5.30pm except when indicated on the main fixture list. There are two such occasions at the start of the playing season and four at the end when tee closures on Tuesdays are 11.30am 12.30pm and 2.30pm 5.00pm.
- 2. The First Tee is closed to gentlemen and ladies from 2.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. on Sundays except where indicated on the Fixture List.
- 3. On Saturdays, the tee will be open to Juniors from 4.00 p.m. except where indicated on the Fixture List or Notice boards.
- **4.** Juniors are permitted to play a medal round on Fridays between 1pm and 2pm unless the tee is reserved for visiting parties.

5. Members should note that, on some competition days, the condition of the course may be affected by the ongoing maintenance programme. Every effort will be made to minimise this situation.

6. Five Day Membership

- *a)* Playing Times any time Monday to Friday only, unless otherwise stated.
- b) Not eligible for Club Competitions except Wednesday Medals (Gents) and Tuesday competitions (Ladies).
- c) Have use of Clubhouse seven days at any recognised time.
- *d)* Five Day Members' privilege tickets are usable in their playing times only.

7. Six Day Membership

- *a)* Playing times any time Sunday to Friday only, unless otherwise stated.
- *b)* Eligible for club competitions being played on these days.
- c) Eligible for Club knockout competitions except those where qualifying takes place on Saturdays.
- d) Have use of Clubhouse seven days at any recognised time.
- e) Six Day Members' privilege tickets are usable in their playing times only.

GENTS' CLUB COMPETITIONS

Please note that, with the exceptions listed elsewhere in the fixture book, club competitions are only open to those who have paid seven day green fees. All monies must be paid on entry, else entry is not guaranteed. All entrants must sign in on the psi terminal before play.

MATCHPLAY COMPETITIONS

Entry is by placing names in the entry book in the pro. shop by the last Saturday in April along with payment of the appropriate fee.

Knockout competitions should, where possible, be mutually arranged between competitors. However, the first named player / players of each individual draw is regarded as the 'challenger'. It is the challenging player's responsibility to provide three dates and times for each tie to be played – one of which must be a weekend date – and all ties should give at least 72 hours

notice between being written on the board and being played. These dates and times must be clearly written on the board. Offering a telephone number does not suffice. The person challenged must indicate on the sheet the accepted date.

It is the winner's responsibility to put their name forward to the next round.

The Match Secretary (M.S.) is regarded as each competition's Director, and any dispute should be taken to the M.S. whose decision is final and cannot be appealed.

NOTES FOR COMPETITIONS

- 1. Class 1 Handicaps up to & including 11.4
 - Class 2 Handicaps 11.5 to 17.4 inclusive.
 - Class 3 Handicaps 17.5 +
- 2. Players must ensure that all scorecards including date, handicap, name of competition & total score are legible and <u>filled in correctly.</u> Failure to do so may result in disqualification from that day's play.
- 3. Players should note that supplementary scores are able to be submitted. Current rules will be posted on the club notice board.

4. All Saturday Competitions – Forward Booking Procedures

Most Saturday competitions can be booked seven days in advance, either on the computer in the Pro shop using a membership card or on line via HowDidIDo. The forward booking process for the coming season will be as follows: online booking and the pro. shop terminal will be available half an hour before the first tee time. Invitational and Open days will see the process extended to two weeks prior to the competition. Members may book for themselves and **one other player only.** Deletions may only be done by a member of the Handicap Sub committee or a member of the Pro. shop staff. Anyone found deleting someone else's name will be liable to disciplinary procedures. Where it is not possible to book online, a paper sheet will be available with early notice being given. Normally the draw for a competition will be posted at 5.15pm on a Friday both on the notice board and where applicable by email. After the draw is made, no player will be permitted to change his tee off time under any circumstances. Players who arrive late, but within five minutes of their listed Saturday time, will incur a two stroke penalty, and those arriving outwith five minutes of their allocated tee off time will be disqualified from the competition, but may queue for play on that day.

5. Sunday Competitions - Russell Trophy.

The timesheet for each round will be made available on the Sunday preceding the competition. This timesheet will determine the order of play with no draw being made, so competitors in the event may play at any time during the day. All players including those playing 'bounce' games must reserve a time on this timesheet and are able to book one complete time slot only. Please note four ball play is allowed in the competition and all competitors must sign in on the psi terminal prior to play.

6. Midweek Competitions - Wednesday Medal.

The timesheet for each round will be made available on the Wednesday preceding the competition. This timesheet will determine the order of play with no draw being made, so competitors in the event may play at any time during the day and four ball play is permitted. However the tee is reserved for three ball medal play only between 3pm and 6pm. All players, including those playing 'bounce' games must reserve a time on this timesheet and are able to book one complete time only. All competitors must sign in on the psi terminal prior to play.

- 7. *Match Play Competitions* No extension will be granted in these competitions, unless with the specific permission of the Match Secretary, following a period of sustained inclement weather.
- 8. With the exceptions already stated above, all Trophies will be decided, if necessary, by a "Count-Back".
- 9. **Opening Day** The Course will be closed until the start of the Opening Day Competition, to be played on the last Saturday in March, unless otherwise stated.

GENTS' MIXED AND OPEN COMPETITIONS

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

Colville Cup - 72 Hole Scratch Stroke-Play Competition. Qualification to play on the final day is the 15 players (or those tied) with the lowest aggregate scratch score over the first two rounds of the Club Championship or those who

are within 10 strokes of the leader whichever is the greater. In the event of a tie, this competition will be decided by a "Sudden Death" Play Off on the day of the Final Rounds. Junior members playing off Senior Medal Tees having a handicap of 9 or less are eligible to play in this competition.

James Anderson Cup - 72 Hole Handicap Competition, played in conjunction with the Club Championship and restricted to Class 1 Players. Qualification to play on the final day is the 24 players (or those tied) with the lowest aggregate nett score over the first 2 rounds of the Club Championship, or those who are within 10 strokes of the leader, whichever is the greater.

The winner of the Club Championship cannot win this competition. In the event of a tie, this competition will be decided by a Play-Off over 18 holes of Stroke Play, on a date to be decided by the Handicap Committee in conjunction with those players involved.

Gazette Cup - 72 Hole Handicap Competition, played in conjunction with the Club Championship and restricted to Class 2 Players. Qualification to play on the final day is the 24 players (or those tied) with the lowest aggregate nett score over the first 2 rounds of the Club Championship, or those who are within 10 strokes of the leader, whichever is the greater. In the event of a tie, this competition will be decided by a Play-Off over 18 holes of Stroke Play, on a date to be decided by the Handicap Committee in conjunction with those players involved.

Gardiner / Laverick Trophy - 54 Hole Handicap Competition, played in conjunction with the Club Championship and restricted to Class 3 Players. Qualification to play on the final day is the 18 players (or those tied) with the lowest aggregate nett score over the first 2 rounds of the Club Championship, or those who are within 10 strokes of the leader, whichever is the greater. In the event of a tie, this competition will be decided by a Play-Off over 18 Holes of Stroke Play, on a date to be decided by the Handicap Committee in conjunction with those players involved.

Every possible strategy will be put in place to have the Championships over the designated number of holes, including using the following week(s) should any round(s) be postponed or abandoned because of the weather. The Committee reserve the right to adapt these arrangements should more than one postponement take place.

Seniors' Championship (The Harry Steele Memorial Trophy)_ - 36 hole gents' handicap competition restricted to those members aged 50 years of age or over on 1st April, 2022, with an official club handicap. To be played on two Thursdays in August from yellow tees, at a time approximate to the club

championships. All entrants must book a time and sign in to the PSI terminal prior to play. Competitors may play at any time during the day. Four ball play is permitted in this competition. In the event of a tie, count back from the second round will be used to establish the winner.

Harvie of Brownlie Trophy - Handicap Match-Play Competition. Entry restricted to the first 64 Players qualifying by Stroke-Play on the second Saturday in April, unless otherwise stated. If necessary a "Count-Back" will be used to decide the final qualifiers.

Anstruther Cup - Handicap Match-Play Competition. Entry restricted to the first 32 Players qualifying by Stroke-Play on the third Saturday in April, unless otherwise stated. If necessary a "Count-Back" will be used to decide the final qualifiers.

Brooks Trophy - Scratch Match-Play Competition. Entry restricted to those Players who hold a Handicap of 8 or under. Entries to be made by last Saturday in April in the relevant page in the Competition entry book held in the Professional's shop.

Monthly Medals - Handicap Stroke Competition. Vouchers will be presented each month to the Winners in each Class. A player may win any number of Medals in the season. In each class the first two players and those with tied scores each month will qualify for the Medal Final. A Player may only qualify once in the season, therefore, where necessary, the next best non-qualifying player will go forward to the Medal Finals.

Those Players who qualify in Class 1 will compete for the **Houldsworth Trophy** on the second Saturday in September, unless otherwise stated.

Those Players who qualify in Class 2 will compete for the **Coltness Trophy** on the second Saturday in September, unless otherwise stated.

Those Players who qualify in Class 3 will compete for the A. McGill Trophy on the second Saturday in September, unless otherwise stated.

Seniors Trophy - Handicap Match-Play Competition. Entry restricted to those Players who are 50 years of age and over on 1st April 2022. Entries to be made by last Saturday in April in the relevant page in the Competition entry book held in the Professional's shop.

Russell Trophy - Handicap Stableford Competition, held on eight Sundays and played from white tees; best four rounds played count for each player. In the

event of a tie, this Competition will be decided by a Play-Off over 18 Holes of Stableford Play, on a date to be decided by the Handicap Committee in conjunction with those players involved.

J. & D. Flynn - Order of Merit Trophy. The best 6 Scratch Scores from the following 10 Competitions will decide the winner. All monthly Medals (6), David Murray Memorial Trophy, Pringle Cup, R. Sommerville Trophy and second round of the Club Championship. In the event of a tie, this competition will be decided by a Play Off over 18 holes of Stroke Play, on a date to be decided by the Handicap Committee in conjunction with the players involved.

Wednesday Medals – Vouchers will be awarded to the winners, in each class, in each round. Players may win more than one Medal. The winner, in each Class, and those with tied scores will qualify to play in the final for the Grant Booth Trophy.

Smyllum Trophy - Gents Two-ball Match-Play Handicap Competition open to all seven and six day adult members. Entries to be made by last Saturday in April in the relevant page in the Competition entry book held in the Professional's shop.

Barr Trophy - Mixed Two-Ball Match Play Handicap Competition open to all seven and six day adult members. Entries to be made by last Saturday in April in the relevant page in the Competition entry book held in the Professional's shop.

Match Play Finals – All match play finals will be held on the third Sunday in September unless specific arrangements have been made with the Match Secretary in conjunction with the players involved. It is recognised that some players may be involved in more than one final, necessitating an alteration to these arrangements.

Walker Rose Bowl – Gents' Open Handicap Competition played annually. Restricted to Players with a Handicap of 24 or under.

Daniel Carmichael Trophy - To be played in conjunction with the Walker Rose Bowl and awarded to the player with the lowest scratch score. (If necessary, count back to decide winner).

Hayes Trophy - Open Mixed Greensome Competition played annually. Handicap Limits: Gentlemen 24, Ladies 36.

Dan Forrest Trophy – Club mixed greensome for seven and six day adult members. To be played on the last Sunday in July. Tee closed 12.00pm – 2.00pm.

LADIES' COMPETITIONS

Championship Cup -54 Hole Scratch Stroke Play Competition.

Mauldslie Cup – 54 Hole Scratch Stroke Play Competition – Bronze Division played in conjunction with Championship.

Sunday Ladies Cup – 54 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition – Silver Division played in conjunction with Championship.

Forest Kirk Shield – 54 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition –Bronze division -played in conjunction with Championship.

Copper Kettle – 54 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition for players with a handicap of 36 +, played in conjunction with Championship.

Betty Henderson Trophy – 18 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition.

Centenary Putter – 18 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition played in conjunction with an SG Medal.

SG Medals (Gold, Silver & Bronze) – Handicap Stroke Play over the SG Medal Competitions and the 4 Competitions marked with an asterisk*. The competitions are won by taking the lowest aggregate of a player's four best net scores in each Division. Winners qualify to play in the Regional Final the following year,

Loch Leven Cup – Handicap Stroke Play over the SG Medal rounds played during current medal year. Players returning the two lowest net scores in each competition qualify for the Final to be played in conjunction with Round 1 of championships in the following year. (Should either of these players have already qualified, the runners up will be nominated). The names of players in contention will be posted in the locker room.

McCallum Shield – Eclectic Competition run in conjunction with the SG Medals in current season.

Ruthven Cup – 36 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition.

Martin Forrest Cup – 18 Hole Stableford Competition in aid of Cystic Fibrosis.

Trust Motors Trophy – 18 Hole Stableford Competition.

Taggart's Trophy – 18 Hole Stableford Competition.

Susan Stratton Memorial Trophy – 18 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition.

Booth Shield – 18 Hole Stableford Competition.

Valley Trophy – 18 Hole 2-ball Foursome Competition. Draw entered with partner.

May Kirkpatrick Trophy – 18 Hole Handicap Stroke Play Competition (non-counting). Restricted to Past Captains.

Roy Carnegie Trophy – 18 Hole Handicap Stroke Play – Open Competition.

Tom Peacock Trophy – 18 Hole Silver Scratch Stroke Play – Open Competition.

Houston Trophy – 18 Hole Bronze Scratch Stroke Play – Open Competition.

The Carol Baskerville Trophy – 18 hole handicap Stroke Play.

Hutton Cup – Handicap Match Play – Singles. Open to seven and six day members. Entries by 30th April. Entry fee £2.

- **R.E. Forrest Trophy** Handicap Match Play Foursomes. Open to seven and six day members. Entries by 30th April. Entry fee £2.
- M. Kyle Trophy Handicap Match Play Singles. Open to seven and six day members. Restricted to Ladies 55 and over. Entries by 30th April. Entry fee £2.

The Red Cross – Eclectic Competition run from May - August. Entry fee £2. All competitions count including completed holes from No Returns.

Early Bird Salver – Eclectic competition, played from April to August, for members taking part in 9-hole qualifying competitions.

9-hole qualifying competitions (Stableford) — Players in all handicap categories, and those holding club handicaps, may play in 9 hole qualifying competitions, and return scores for handicap purposes. In accordance with CONGU rules, play will be in stableford format, and scores will be adjusted to provide an 18 hole score.

COMPETITION NOTES

- a. Tee times for Tuesday competitions on 29th March, 5th April, 20th, and 27th September, and 4th and 11th October will be as follows; 11.30am 12.30pm and 2.30pm 5.00pm Tee times for the remaining Tuesday competitions will be 11.30am 12.30pm and 3.30pm 5.30pm.
- b. Tuesday Competition entry online booking for ladies' Tuesday competitions will be available on How Did I Do or on the computer in the Pro. shop, from 9am on the Tuesday prior to the competition. Members can book for themselves and one other member only. The draw for Tuesday competitions will be posted by 5pm on a Monday, both in the ladies' locker room, and where applicable by E mail. Those wishing to play after 5.15pm must reserve a time via BRS.
- c. All players must sign in at the PSI terminal in the Pro. shop, where the competition fee, and sweep if applicable, will be deducted from their account.
- d. £6.00 will be collected on the pre-season night, for donations to Cystic Fibrosis (£2), Cancer Relief (£2), and British Red Cross (£2). Further donations will be accepted on the appropriate competition days.
- e. Competitions should be played as a 3-ball and where possible the 3-ball rule maintained. Penalty for starting late, but within five minutes of start time, will be a two stroke penalty at first hole.

- f. A member who cannot play within competition times due to unsocial working hours, will be permitted to play with an arranged partner or a marker, provided 24 hours notice is given to a member of the handicap sub committee.
- g. Players must ensure all scorecards have been dated, have name clearly legible, have been totalled (including stableford competitions) and have been signed by player and marker. Failure to comply may result in disqualification.
- h. Championship players, where possible, will be grouped by Handicaps i.e. Scratch 20.4, 20.5 +. In the event of a tie, the contenders will play a full round (using same Handicaps) on the following normal Tuesday competition. A further tie will be decided by "sudden death". Individuals may only win one Trophy, but can be runner-up for another. Participants will remain in the same Division throughout.
- i. In the event of a tie for winner or runner up, the winner / runner up will be decided on the BIH, (excluding Championship and Lochleven Cup)
- j. In the event of a tie for the Championship runner up, the runner up will be decided on the BIH of the final round.
- k. Match play competitions are restricted to 6 and 7 day members, as players must be able to play on a Sunday.
- l. Entry is by notification, usually at the pre-season night, together with payment of the appropriate entry fee. Late entry may be notified to the handicap sub committee before the draw is made.
- m. Match play competitions are part of the remit of the Match Secretary who is regarded as director of all the competitions. Any dispute regarding a tie should be taken to the Match Secretary whose decision is final and cannot be appealed.
- n. The draws for match play competitions will be posted in the ladies' locker room notice board with the first named in each tie being the challenger. While it is hoped arrangements will be agreed mutually, it is the duty of the challenger to provide three possible dates for the tie to be played and to WRITE these clearly on the draw sheet. One of these dates must be a Sunday and 72 hours notice must be given by both parties. Offering a telephone number does not suffice. The person challenged must indicate on the sheet the accepted date. The winner should put their name forward to the next round.
- o. No extension will be given to matchplay competitions unless by the Match Secretary following a prolonged spell of poor weather.

JUNIOR SECTION

COMPETITIONS

The Junior Section is open to boys and girls who have not reached the age of eighteen at the start of the playing season.

Unless specified elsewhere, it meets on Sundays at 2pm throughout the season and participates in the Lanarkshire Junior league, when possible. There is a full calendar of events listed in the fixture book.

New members, unless they have previous experience, begin on the specially tailored six hole course with progression to playing on the main course being determined by ability. The club rules regarding handicaps and tees to use are posted on the notice boards in the Ladies' and Gents' locker rooms. The trophies contested include:

White Tees:

McEwan Trophy – 18 hole scratch stroke play, Junior Trophy – 18 hole handicap stroke play, Rotary Cup – 18 hole handicap stroke play, Professional Trophy – 18 hole scratch stroke play, Stableford Cup – 18 hole handicap stableford, Hallcraig Trophy – 54 hole scratch club championship, Trust Motors Shield – 54 hole handicap club championship.

Blue Tees:

Boys: Jackson Trophy – 18 hole scratch stroke play, Ford Trophy – 18 hole handicap stroke play, Madras Shield – 18 hole handicap stroke play, Law Trophy – 18 hole handicap stroke play, Stableford Cup – 18 hole handicap stableford, Langshaw Salver – 54 hole scratch club championship, Ricky Forrest Shield – 54 hole handicap club championship.

Red Tees

Girls: Junior Cup – scratch stroke play competition, Allison Booth Salver – handicap stroke play, Stroke Shield – handicap stroke play, Craig Cup – handicap stroke play, Stableford Cup – handicap stableford, Girls' Championship – 3 round scratch stroke play, John Peacock Memorial Trophy – 3 round handicap club championship.

Others include Summer Cup match play championship, Booth Trophy (most improved junior), Eclectic Shield (run over the school summer holidays), The Peter Cowan Memorial Salver, Junior Salver – best young player for nine holes from the Blue Tees, Vice Captain's Salver, and the Little Gems Cup – the latter two restricted to players on the six hole course.

NOTES

During the period 29^{th} June and 10^{th} August (Tuesdays), the Eclectic Competition will be played in the afternoon between the hours of 1p.m. and 2 p.m.

Late starts may be allowed, provided members have a reasonable excuse. Application must be made to Junior Convenor prior to competition dates. Juniors are permitted to play a medal round on Fridays between 1pm and 2pm unless the tee is reserved for visiting parties.

Girls with a CONGU handicap of 36 and under can play in all 18 hole competitions in

both ladies' and junior sections.
