# **HISTORY OF THE CLUB - PART 4**

In the year of 1960 the future of the club was in doubt as the club failed to form a Committee at the AGM, however, the club carried on with various events held with the first Gents annual dinner held in the clubhouse.

At the end of October in 1964 the new clubhouse was opened by Roberta Forrest and John Kelly. The ladies had their own section of the clubhouse and they set about furnishing their lounge with a new carpet being installed for a sum of £150 which was shortly stolen the first weekend after being laid. Burglars had got in as no snibs had been fitted on the small windows but the would be thieves weren't the sharpest tools in the box as the carpet was found under a hedge and soon relaid.

By the mid 1970s The Club purchased the course from Lanark County Council and the clubhouse would later be extended to the south facing side to form a larger lounge area overlooking the course.

In 1977 the club won the Lanarkshire Golf Association league for the first time with mementoes of sweaters and medals being given to the victorious team pictured below.
