I hope you all have a fantastic season, your golf matches your expectations and I look forward to catching up with everyone at some point throughout the year.



COURSE UPDATE

Hi Folks

Hope you are all well and still afloat. This weather for the past six months has been quite horrific and has had an adverse effect on the playability of the course. We find ourselves in the middle of April, with Winter rules still in place and the course closed, almost as often as its open.

This has been by far the wettest Winter any of us can remember, not helped by the fact that we had very little frost and virtually no snow!!

So far this month, we have had over 130mm of rain measured in the rain gauge, which as I've said before, just gives a rough estimate of what has fallen. For those of you still dealing in old money, thats not far short of six inches of rain ... in two weeks!!! Hardly surprising then that the course is wet.

As well as plenty of the wet stuff it has also been very mild on the whole, so the grass (that we can't get onto to cut because it's so wet)

hasn't really stopped growing.

We are hopeful that there is dry weather ahead that will allow us to actually get machines out and cut the fairways and rough. However, due to the excess growth in the mild conditions, it will take a few cuts to get everything to the proper height of cut for the time of year, so please bear with us and don't expect miracles as soon as we get a couple of dry days.

Unfortunately we have seen a recent rise in the amount of un-repaired pitch marks <u>AND</u> divots. This is essential maintenance that is the responsibility of EVERY member and if not carried out will result in a decline in the standard of our golf course. Please politely remind your playing partners if they simply forget (it happens).

For those that are not aware, each green is allocated a letter of the alphabet and members with a surname beginning with the letter should ADOPT the green and make an effort to not only repair their own pitch marks but also any others they find on that green.

We have a register of members with appropriate skills that are willing to give their voluntary time to maintaining and enhancing the clubhouse and course. There is a sheet on the noticeboard for anyone wishing to add their name or you can do so anonymously by contacting any Committee member

6 HOLE COURSE / PRATICE AREA

A couple of things we need to remind members of is that if you plan to use the practice area or the short game area please check-in at the Pro Shop. This is required purely for us to know the numbers. In the past we have sent people down believing it is empty only for the players to return to the shop and complain.

Please be aware that the practice area is first and foremost a 6 hole course, therefore, people who book the 6 hole course will have preference over casual practice. When using the area for casual practice, if possible, use the mats, however, grass practice will be marked but please only hit one way. Please do not hit balls back towards the 2nd tee as this causes unnecessary divots to be taken out of the 6 hole course. We would like the course to stay in good condition for the kids that have competitions on it. Thank-you.
