I hope you all have a fantastic season, your golf matches your expectations and I look


forward to catching up with everyone at some point throughout the season.



COURSE UPDATE

Hi All

Been a wee while since our last newsletter so a lot to catch up on, so, if you're sitting comfortably, I'll begin.....

Fears of a wet Winter, on top of the already wet course, causing weeks of course closures were unfounded, as we had one of the driest Winters we've had for many years. Indeed, the dry weather has continued since the turn of the year, with only around 170mm of rain from the start of January to the end of April!!!!

To put that into context, in the same 4 month period last year, we had about 450mm, followed by the month of May, which had 170mm!!!! In fact, the 4 month period from May to August produced 510mm of rain. Thank goodness it did stop, or at least ease off!!!!

We did have one weather warning this Spring, a red one indeed, with storm Eowyn, which downed one of the oldest and most prominent trees on the golf course. The tree to the right of the 8th green, remarkably fell backwards, away from the green and against the way the wind was blowing!!! Hard to understand but a real escape because it would have caused serious damage to the green. We have removed the tree and stump and created a mounded area in its place. There was talk of putting in a bunker or two on that side, but the course is hard enough!

- During the rest of the Winter, we did the planned drainage work. We built new teeing areas at 14, 17 and 18 to use during the Winter season.
- We extended the 6th medal tee.
- We built up and re-turfed the low area to the right of the 3rd green.
- We dug out, drained and backfilled and turfed the area under the tree on the banking at the 13th green.
- We installed new pipework in the ditch on the right of the 4th and filled in the ditch, thus removing an unnecessary penalty area.
- We installed 60 metres of main drain at the other side of the road at the 4th.
- We removed and backfilled and turfed the old tree stump at the start of the 6th fairway.
- We relaid the rubber mat path up the 12th.

COURSE UPDATE

We did a lot of tree trimming especially around the 11th and 12th to open areas up.

We removed a lot of tree stumps we never got to last year.

Think that's about it......

And then we started on Spring work!!

Because it's been pretty dry we've been able to get a lot more cutting done than we have in previous seasons, particularly fairways and rough.

The greens have been solid tined, and deep scarified, overseeded and top dressed. They were fed a couple of weeks ago and are starting to fill in, but this will, as usual, take a wee bit of time and patience. It's all very well half the folk out there in shorts and tee shirts, but when the overnight temperatures are still low,(and I've just heard wee Sean on STV saying it could be minus 1 or 2 for the May bank holiday weekend!!) the soil temperatures remain low and the grass won't grow in.

On a brighter note, it is quite pleasant for playing golf I suppose.

Another problem for the greens in particular is the aforementioned lack of rain. Not having a proper watering system, (and remember all we did was move some of the taps closer to the greens) meant we rely heavily on rain to irrigate the greens and regulate, as much as possible, the water content. It is also a drawback not being able to apply fertiliser in the current warm temperatures we are enjoying, and simply turn on the pop ups at two in the morning, because, if it stayed dry then we would not be able to stop the greens from drying out and burning up, with the system we have. However for around £750 000 we could install a fully automated system and...problem solved. How much of a levy would that be Lynne....?

Anyway back in the real world and shockeroonie......we watered the greens this week, first time since June 2023!!!! I even took a picture to prove it!



COURSE MAINTENANCE - MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

Unfortunately we have seen a recent rise in the amount of un-repaired pitch marks <u>AND</u> divots. This is essential maintenance that is the responsibility of EVERY member and if not carried out will result in a decline in the standard of our golf course. Please politely remind your playing partners if they simply forget (it happens).

For those that are not aware, each green is allocated a letter of the alphabet and members with a surname beginning with the letter should ADOPT the green and make an effort to not only repair their own pitch marks but also any others they find on that green.

HOW TO PLAY

- Place a £1 coin in the envelope, seal it and post it in the money box next to the board.
